Why does my family need Prayer Space at home?

By creating a Prayer Space at home everyone is reminded that prayer is an important part of everyday life...That you can pray anywhere, not just in church. Plus have a Prayer Space at home reminds us of God's presence at all times.

A Prayer Space can be as simple as the end of a dining room table, an end table beside the couch, or a shelf on the wall. All you would need is a cross, candle and a bible. Just a little something to remind you to say a little prayer.

If you pray before going to sleep, your bedroom can be your Prayer Space. Maybe have a few prayer cards, a special prayer book, or a rosary on your night stand. You could also purchase a small statue of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Jesus or a saint that you have a special devotion to.

Space you probably haven't thought of...

Kitchen Sink...Hand-washing dishes could be a sweet time for prayer. While cleaning the dishes you can clean out your heart.

The car...when you are stopped at a stop light...it's a great time to say a quick prayer giving thanks for all that you have and petition for something...say a quick prayer for a person in need.

While mowing the lawn...the lawn mower blocks out other sounds, which can give you space to pray. You can enter a peaceful prayer room in your mind.

We all need to recognize those special locations as a call to prayer. Growing in prayer helps us all have that special relationship with Christ.
